Prior Learning	<p>Throughout primary school, students will have an understanding of the following areas through the statutory relationships education curriculum: families and people who care for me, caring friendships, respectful relationships, on-line relationships, and being safe. Through the statutory physical health and mental wellbeing primary curriculum, students will also have an understanding of: mental wellbeing, internet safety and harms, physical health and fitness, healthy eating, drugs, alcohol and tobacco, health and prevention, basic first aid, and the changing adolescent body.</p>
What will I learn?	<p>The Year 7 curriculum aims to build upon knowledge acquired from primary school. Students will study relationships and sex education, health education, understanding the law, keeping safe, wellbeing, first aid, finance, and careers. Students will also receive visits from a variety of guest speakers during lesson time and assemblies – NHS, Fire Service, Police, Post 16 providers, Positive Action in the Community (PAC - Friendships). How will I be assessed?	<p>Formative assessment will take place throughout each lesson such as question and answer discussions, mini whiteboard work and retrieval activities. Summative assessment will take place at the end of John 10:10, Pol-Ed, Finance / First Aid topics.</p>
Next Steps	<p>At the end of Year 7, students will progress on to the Year 8 PSHE curriculum within the dedicated one hour per week lesson time. Year 8 topics will follow on from those topics taught in Year 7. See links to Pol-Ed, John 10:10, First Aid, and Finance for specific year group lessons.</p>
Opportunities for Independent Learning	<p>A variety of links related to each lesson are displayed during each lesson. Students are given access to these links through their synergy accounts. Personal development topics can also be accessed through 'The Day' The Day - Homepage - The Day</p>
Personal Development and CEIAG	<p>PSHE forms part of the Personal Development curriculum. Each week throughout morning Personal Development (PD) time students are given the opportunity to discuss areas of PSHE through 'The Day' (on-line news articles). Each Friday during PD time students watch and discuss the 2 'job of the week' videos. A range of guest speakers are invited to speak to classes and whole year groups throughout the year on topics related to Personal Development, PSHE and CEIAG. Guest speakers use both assembly time and PSHE lessons to speak to classes and whole year groups. All year 7's will receive an enrichment day in the spring term related to 'the world of work' - a variety of businesses attend the full day event to give students an insight into work and career paths. Each Year 7 PSHE class is also visited by either Nelson and Colne College or Burnley College to receive a talk about preparing themselves for life after Fisher More.</p>
Enrichment Opportunities (Cultural Capital)	<p>A variety of enrichment activities linked to personal development can be accessed each week through both the sporting and curriculum extra curricular programmes – students are encouraged to engage with as many enrichment activities as possible and should consult with the weekly programmes displayed by their form tutors.</p>
