Personal Development and CEIAG

PSHE forms part of the Personal Development curriculum.
Each week throughout morning Personal Development (PD) time students will also be given the opportunity to discuss areas of PSHE through 'The Day' (on-line news articles). Each Friday during PD students watch and discuss the 2 'job of the week' videos.
A range of guest speakers are invited to speak to classes and whole year groups throughout the year on topics related to Personal Development, PSHE and CEIAG. Guest speakers use both assembly time and PSHE Monday lessons to speak to both classes and whole year groups. Each Year 9 PSHE class is also visited by either Nelson and Colne College or Burnley College to receive a talk about preparing themselves for life after Fisher More. All Year 9 forms receive a talk from our Independent Careers Advisor – Claire Baker – in the lead up to choosing their options in February.

Enrichment Opportunities (Cultural Capital)
